SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

Next Sunday marks the end of the Church's Liturgical Year. On the feast of Christ the King, the Church grants a plenary indulgence to those who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed, consecrate the human race to Christ the King and recites the Litany of the Sacred Heart. The indulgence may be applied to a soul in purgatory. The extra prayers would extend Mass by under 10 min.

CHILDREN

Parents should supervise their children at all times while at Church; that includes using the children's room and going to the rest room - to utilise a much nicer American phrase. It is important that children get a sense of the Church as a safe, friendly and welcoming Sacred Space.
