FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD JESUS

Before his passion Jesus took with him his three closest disciples, Peter, James, and John to the summit of a high mountain. Tradition identifies this mountain as Mount Tabor in Galilee. Mount Tabor is about two thousand feet above the Lake of Tiberias. While at the top of the mountain, Jesus was transfigured. He revealed his divine glory to them. "His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became white as snow, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. And Moses and Elijah appeared: they were talking with Jesus." (Mk 9: 2-9) Moses and Elijah represented the Law and the Prophets. And the voice of the Father came from heaven declaring Jesus his only begotten Son. The glorious sight filled them with awe and Peter spoke saying how wonderful it was for them to be there. As he spoke, a cloud came and covered them. In the Old Testament the cloud was the visible sign of the presence of God and a manifestation of his glory (Ex 16: 10; Num 16: 42) It revealed, 'the Shekinah glory' of God. Which means the divine presence of God. Among the suggested reasons for the Transfiguration, some say that towards the end of his time on earth, Jesus gave his beloved disciples a foretaste of the kingdom of heaven and his glory, to strengthen their faith for his passion and death.
