Today there will be a retiring collection for the poor parishes of the diocese.

This enables the Archbishop to offer support to parishes in need.

HOLY SEASON OF LENT

Wednesday marks the beginning of the Holy Season of Lent. While Ash Wednesday is not a Holy day of obligation, I would encourage you to try and attend Holy Mass. If you are unable to attend, set aside a few minutes in your day to pray & reflect. During Lent we are encouraged to either give something up or to take up an extra spiritual duty like praying the rosary or meditating on the Sacred Scriptures.

During Lent, we especially focus on Prayer, fasting and almsgiving – thinking about those in need and offering financial support according to our means.

FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics, health permitting, are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday from age 14 (from midnight on their 14th birthday) – this endures throughout life.

Catholics, health permitting, are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday from age 18 (from midnight on their 18th birthday) until the beginning of their 60th year (i.e. midnight on their 59th birthday). Fasting is customarily defined as one regular meal and two small snacks.

CRYING ROOM

Thank you, your generosity has enabled us to make the crying room, off of the confessional, more child friendly. Children must be supervised at all times.

CHURCH HALL

The boiler in the hall has finally given up the ghost. The new one will be fitted this week costing £2000.

CHURCH HEATING
