## PARISH HALL

Work has begun to repair the leaking flat roof over the mens toilets in the hall. Water ingress has affected the electrical circuits; this will also be addressed. The cost of the work is £3000.

## PARISH READERS

We are in need of additional readers for the Saturday evening and two Sunday morning Masses. Readers operate on a rota basis. It is very easy to either swap your allotted slot or have someone else stand in for you. To be a reader, you must be an articulate Catholic who desires to communicate the message of God's word to others. You must dress smartly and act with reverence. If you are interested, please give your name in at the sacristy.

## GETTING MARRIED

In order to be validly married, a Catholic is bound to marry before a priest or deacon and two witnesses. If you intend to marry anywhere in the world, universe or solar system, you must give a minimum of six months notice to the parish priest in whose parish you are domiciled; it is he who will prepare the paperwork, not the parish priest where you intend to get married.

If you are civilly married, or have been through a tribal marriage, your marriage can be validated in the Church providing there are no impediments. Do not hesitate to ask.

## ANNULMENTS

Divorce is often a painful period in a person's life. The Church is always here to support and walk with you. Divorce does not prevent you from receiving Holy Communion or from being an active member of your Church. As part of the healing and moving on process, the Church is empowered to examine marriages and, in certain instances, grant a declaration of nullity which enables both parties to marry in the Catholic Church. Pope Francis has shortened this process. Please do not hesitate to ask if you have any questions or need support.
